July brings a new budget year for the Town. I am proud to say that town staff and Town Council were able to balance the budget with no tax increases to residents all while keeping the same service and amenity levels for residents. The budget for the Town, including its two enterprise funds (Electric and PCS), is \$37,605,000. This budget includes investments in employees, road, and sidewalk infrastructure for better mobility, and maintaining programming in the Parks and Recreation department. Several large projects that will start this year include the replacement of the current Fire Department with a brand-new building, construction of a substation to better serve electric customers, and a new facility for our Electric and Communication employees. I am thankful for everyone who worked hard to put this budget together.

The beginning of summer also kicks off a lot of programming for our residents to enjoy. I hope everyone will take time to enjoy the Splash Pad, Rock 'n & Reel 'n, our Main Street Concert series, fireworks, the amazing businesses downtown, and all of the other activities planned for this summer. There is something for everyone! Please follow the Town's social media channels to stay "in-the-know" of what is going on.

Finally, one of the best things about the Town of Pineville is the people. We have some of the best individuals serving this community, and I appreciate each of them immensely. Public Service

BE THE SOLUTION TO WATER POLLUTION!



Many of us have a stream in our neighborhood or backyard. If not, then you typically cross over at least one stream on your way to work or to the grocery store. Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services (CMSWS) staff have many ways to monitor these streams, which include field work, creek cameras, and automated monitoring systems. However, with 3,000 miles of streams throughout the county, it can be difficult for CMSWS to have eyes on every inch of this abundant water resource.

CMSWS relies heavily on residents to report potential water quality issues. For example, if you see a creek that is orange in color, this discoloration is typically from loose sediment that isn't being properly contained on a construction site. If this situation isn't investigated in a timely manner, the excess sediment could deplete dissolved oxygen in the streams which can be harmful to fish and other aquatic species. Residents can use the **CLT + app** or call **311** to report stormwater pollution concerns. CMSWS staff is available 24 hours a day to respond to calls. 


